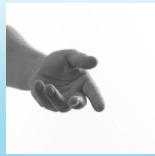

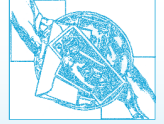


First Friday Adoration. . .

Is requesting donations for the **Shared Blessings Food Pantry**. It is a very difficult time for some, and we have many families in need of food. The FOSA collects food and volunteers for the food pantry, which is in the basement of the Danville Methodist church, located at 820 W. Mill St. in Danville (a couple blocks south of the church). The pantry is a collaborative effort which the Danville Methodist Church, Danville Christian Church, and Mary Queen of Peace all support. When people call the church in need of food this is where we refer them. The pantry is open on Tuesday evenings from 6 p.m. to 7:30 p.m. and Saturday mornings 10 a.m. to 12 p.m. Suggested food items include: peanut butter, jelly, pastas and sauces, cereal, macaroni and cheese, hamburger helper, canned fruit, soup, crackers, laundry soap, and dish soap. Please place all food donations in the wicker basket located just inside the front doors of the church.
