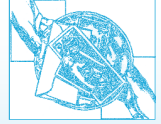
It's Rummage Sale Time!

Word of Life. . .

"Concerns about health care costs and general financial uncertainty, along with serious discussions about limiting health care for the elderly, are currently reaching the boiling point. If assisted suicide is added to the cauldron, the final result can be doubly lethal. Making assisted suicide a medical treatment gives it the status of only one among many options for the treatment of certain conditions. In cost-effectiveness assisted suicide differs in a major way from other treatments. It is extremely affordable and can always be covered by health insurance. The force of economic gravity can lead to increased pressure on patients to request, and doctors to prescribe, assisted suicide."

Letter from the Director of Religious Education

Preventing child sexual abuse is the goal of a program offered by the Archdiocese of Indianapolis. The VIRTUS Program is meant to educate parents, clergy, staff, volunteers, and other parish adults about child abuse and the ways to create safe environments for children. The 3 hour program includes videos and facilitated discussions that focus on information as to how a predator grooms his or her victims, signs and symptoms that an adult is a potential risk of harm to children, and how to recognize that a child is being abused or exploited in some way. You will also learn about steps that the faith community can take to create a safe environment for all God's children and how to respond when adults behave in a way that raises concerns. Mary, Queen of Peace will be hosting a VIRTUS [presentation on Monday, October 12th, 6:30-9:00 pm in the Parish Hall](#). Clergy, staff, and R.E. volunteers are required to attend this program. All other adults-especially parents-are invited and encouraged to participate in the presentation for information leading to a safer environment for all our children.
